- Interactive stations for the public to learn about proposed projects being evaluated by the LPC and to share their thoughts on transformational impact.

Melia Hema (MJ) explained that the open house was publicized via a flyer, a social media graphic that was sent to the public library, the local school district and the Alexandria Bay Chamber of Commerce. The open house was also mentioned on the local news.

A table of the advancing projects and their public input was then displayed. Majority of the projects were being perceived as having "High" level of transformative potential during the open house.

The projects are scored according to criteria outlined by the NY Forward program, using State and Local goals, and are evaluated based on their impact to the downtown.

## **Pipeline Project Discussion**

#### **Discussion**

Jennifer Ceponis (MJ) went into detail about the pipeline projects and projects previously identified as such:

 Pipeline/supporting are projects proposed in the NYF process that are great ideas but are not ready to receive NYF funding for a variety of reasons. For these projects, the LPC may elect to include these projects in the SIP as supporting or pipeline projects. While not recommended for NYF funding, these projects are consistent with the goals of NYF and the community's vision and the LPC would like to include them as potential areas for revitalization within the downtown.

#### Projects previously identified by the LPC as potential Pipeline Projects:

- A03 Core Streetscape Extension
- A04 Scenic View Park & Casino Island
- B20 Bonnie Castle Resort & Marina

The LPC reviewed the non-advancing projects to determine if they should be in the Pipeline Projects list, listed as support for small projects fund, or both. Projects outside the NY Forward boundary, rented properties, and those withdrawn by sponsors were dismissed.
